

After the creative concept is signed off, 3D vinyl is created in two parts:

- 1. The background vinyl (aka "Vinyl") is your standard vinyl that covers the entire flat surface of the billboard face and;
- 2. The 3D Prop (aka "Prop") is attached to the vinyl to create the 3D

AND

The vinyl and the prop require separate artwork files. Here's the rundown on both:



The graphic of the prop itself needs to be removed from the vinyl creative. Regardless of where the prop is placed on the vinyl there needs to be a complete finished print behind. Here's an example:

ORIGINAL CREATIVE CONCEPT



The vinyl behind the prop needs to be printed as if you simply removed the car.

ACCEPTED FILE TYPES FOR VINYL ARTWORK:

PDF - fonts outlined & high res

Adobe Photoshop - include layers, high res

Adobe InDesign - include .idml, packaged, high res

it is recommended building the vinyl file so that 0.5 inch is equal to 1 foot at 300 dpi



In order to create the 3D Prop, multiple angles of the same 3D graphic are required. Here's an example:

ACCEPTED FILE TYPES FOR PROP ARTWORK:

Vector, - ideally detailed vector artwork Adobe Illustrator in multiple angles is best or PDF

OTHER OPTIONS ACCEPTED ARE:

Adobe Photoshop - highest res as possible, multiple angles

EPS / TIF - highest res possible, multiple angles

(NO JPG / PNG or GIF)

** **Please Note:** if you have a logo on your prop the logo needs to be on a separate layer and needs to be vector to ensure the best quality. As well as we may ask for pantone colours for matching purposes **
